Lanterns at the Lodge

Children in Years 3,4,5 and 6 have been constructing willow lanterns for the Oxfordshire Artweeks exhibition at Kingham Lodge. This gave them the opportunity to manipulate and build with natural wood, to work collaboratively to solve problems and to agree on designs. As our pupils have been looking at 'Shape' in maths, creating the lanterns as triangular based pyramids has helped to consolidate their understanding... although the children were surprised how the willow twisted through the process.



Each class has used different designs: for example, Y4 has used the Thai festival of 'Songkran' as inspiration and Y3 based their work on the artist Matisse.
