If your child wishes to, they can bring along an item of food (small enough for them to carry) which they can drop at the church entrance as we arrive. The foodbank welcomes all non-perishable items with 6 months shelf-life, but especially the following:

- tinned rice pudding or custard
- tinned fruit of all types
- tinned vegetables including potatoes, carrots, peas, sweetcorn and tomatoes
- 500g packets of rice and pasta
- Cereals
- Washing up liquid, cleaning materials and liquid or tablet soap "powder"
