## Covid-19 Update

There is new national guidance for people who have symptoms of respiratory infections including COVID-19 and/or a positive test result - [People with symptoms of a respiratory infection including COVID-19 \(www.gov.uk\)](https://www.gov.uk/guidance/people-with-symptoms-of-a-respiratory-infection-including-covid-19). The key points are:

- Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education or childcare setting.
- Children who are unwell and have a [high temperature](#) should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough.
- It is not recommended that children are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional. If a child does have a positive COVID-19 test result, they should not come to school for 3 days after the day they took the test. The risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower after 3 days if they feel well and do not have a high temperature.
